

RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT STRATEGIES

Considerations:

- 1. Size of the home (usually the number of bedrooms)
- 2. Land area available for treatment system
- 3. Type of soil and its suitability for treatment
- 4. Proximity to surface water
- 5. Regulations of the local health department and federal or state Environmental Protection Agency
- 6. How often the system will be serviced

Typical Solutions:

- 1. A residential septic system including:
 - a) A septic tank
 - b) A Bio-Kinetic wastewater management system
 - c) An effluent disposal system (may require a Norweco residential pump dosing station)
- 2. An aerobic wastewater treatment system such as the Singulair Model 960 wastewater treatment system
- 3. A raw sewage pump station such as a Lift-Rail pump station or a residential pump station to move the raw wastewater to a central collection system for treatment at a remote location
